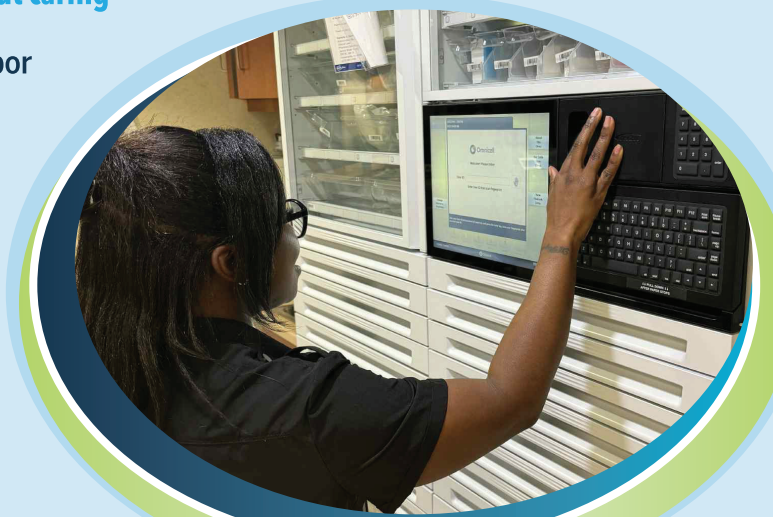

- Q This year marks your 20th year of service at Jennie Stuart Health. What has inspired you to continue your career here, and what keeps you committed to the field of Labor and Delivery?**
“My mother worked at Jennie Stuart for 33 years, so I essentially grew up here. It’s home for me. After 20 years in labor and delivery, I can honestly say it’s the people and the moments that keep me here. I truly love what I do.”

“As team lead, I try to lead by example. I think it’s important for my team to always feel supported and know that we’re in this together. I stand beside my team, not above them.”

Tree of Life Art Installation Dedication Ceremony

Located inside Jennie Stuart Medical Center is a meaningful display, made possible by Gail and Malcolm Blane. It was created to embody the mission of the Foundation's Tree of Life Fund.

Rooted in the vision of the Howard Stone Memorial Fund (1976) and carried forward through the Tree of Life Fund (1996), this effort continues to support patients and families of the E.C. Green Cancer Center.

The fund helps ease burdens like transportation and medication costs, provides resources and equipment that enhance treatment, and offers a meaningful way to honor or remember loved ones.

The newly dedicated installation, a sculpture paired with a digital screen, now stands as a lasting symbol of hope, remembrance, and generosity. It reflects the power of how philanthropy and partnership transform patient care, reminding us of what becomes possible when generosity meets vision.
